1 Namiita Beach

This beach is known for its "one-sided" waves, where incoming waves come in but people come to this well-known beach ir Otsuchi to enjoy ocean pastimes like surf ing. You can also enojoy the morning sun rising from Funakoshi Bay and the lovely sight of the moon at night. Nearby are rest areas, cafes, the Namita Beach Village group of community facilities, and Sanriku Hana Hotel Hamagiku.

5 Kirikiri Beach Kirikiri Beach's name came from the Ainu word "kirikiri," which means white sandy beach. An alternate explanation for the name is that the rough "singing sand" squeaks - "kiri-kiri" - as you walk. In summer, this swimming

6 Sakiyama Viewpoint from Sakiyama Viewpoint, which sits on the Rias Scenic Line road from Kirikiri Beach to Akahama, a wide swath of the Pacific Ocean is visible including Namiita Beach and Funakoshi Bay. Enjoy a splendid view peneath you of Nojima Island's contrast of reen pines and white rocks. This viewpoint also popular as an excellent spot to watch he first sunrise of the year

Mt. Kujira

This 610 meter sacred mountain with a history of whale egends ("kujira" means whale) sits on the boundary between Yamada Town and Otsuchi Town. You can see this mountain well from Funakoshi Bay and Kirikiri Bay, and its unique shape served as a landmark for ships sailing in and out of the ocean around Sanriku. Enjoy great views of the ria coastline from the mountaintop.

Otsuchi Town Spring



The Three-Spined Stickleback is an unusual fish, with population that live only in freshwater, and other populations that go to the sea and return to freshwater to breed. Otsuchi Town is unique within Japan in that it has three populations, including a hybrid o the exclusively freshwater and freshwater-sea types. Gensui River 🌷 is a freshwater river with a constant temperature of around 15 egrees Celsius, and it houses freshwater Three-Spined Sticklepacks. Sticklebacks couldn't survive in here without this cold, clean

Otsuchi's Light of Hope is a gas lamp installed inside Shiroyama Park to memorialize the tragedy of the March 2011 tsunami and pray for recovery. It was placed in front of Chuo Community Center which overlooks the center of the town. Its flame, the dead came from Kobé City and is shared with Rikuzentakata City and Minamisoma City.

HIKING THE MICHINOKU COASTAL TRAIL

Choose a course that fits you. based on your stamina and experience, the length of the route, and altitude variation. Make your plan carefully if you choose a course with difficult parts.

Hike at your own pace. guide to accompany you if you need one or join a group tour. Let's enjoy hiking the trail safely!

Imagine the whole route. First, plan how to get to your starting point, and consider the distance of the whole route and the time required for it. If you also plan ahead where to eat lunch or have breaks, it will make the long distance easier to manage and more bearable. Make sure to check where the safety evacuation areas are on your map in case of disaster. Look for point that could be dangerous and this about how to handle them. We recommend you check the tide level and

Being safe is based on having good judgmen Don't strain yourself. You can arrange for a

Clothing & Gear A brimmed *Clothing* hat is good for sun protection. If you go hiking in winter Wear comfortable layered clothing that can be easily worn or removed when season, try to wea necessary to regulate your body temperature. *Backpack* Carrying water is a must for keeping hydrated. A backpack hip belt or chest straps will help prevent fatigue *Trekking poles* They can help minimize impact on your knees. *Gaiters* Gaiters protect your ankles from bushes or mud. *Trekking shoes* Wear comfortable shoes you've broken in beforehand.
